**BUSINESS:**

❖ **October 13 Meeting**

Tom will lead an assessment of the program at our next meeting with emphasis on how to make it even better next year. In conjunction, Zan Marie Steadham will report on planning for the January program at the Regional Library.

She also teaches seminars titled “The Down Home Writing School” and offered the members a discount on her next session, March 6. The members present also discussed her offer to come to Carrollton and hold a seminar for our members next year. Be sure to check out Laretta’s book, *The Cracker Queen, a Memoir of a Jagged, Joyful Life*. Laretta is now working on a novel and a sequel to *The Cracker Queen* and said, “I never knew what fun it is to play in the unfettered land of the imagination.”

**September 22 Meeting**

Business:

~~Zan Marie Steadham announced that it is time for her to pass the Newsletter on to another member after sixteen months in the job. She will continue until the end of the year. Please email Zan Marie if you are interested. Richard Anderson has volunteered to continue as copy editor.

  - Cleanup from 5 to 6 pm

  - Program practice will be on December 8 during our meeting time .

  - Readings should be short to allow more to read (How long will depend on how many volunteer. The members present expressed the desire for some of the members who haven't read at the last two shows to consider offering to read.)
  - We will discuss when to get our items to the Regional Library at the December meeting. Zan Marie volunteered to store and deliver items you want displayed, if you bring them to that meeting, but space is limited. If you will be in town on the set-up date, bring them by the library yourself.
  - There will be a table set up to sell and sign books.
  - We will display the club banner along with the framed covers.
